Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome! You and your student(s) are about to embark on a learning adventure with Rogue Outdoor School. Outdoor School (ODS) is an Oregon tradition that has been around for more than 60 years and started right here in Southern Oregon. ODS is a residential science field trip that takes place at camps all over the state. Through the funding provided by Measure 99, all 5th and 6th graders in Oregon are able to participate in ODS for free! Positive outcomes of Outdoor School include:

- A powerful compliment to 5th/6th grade science curriculum
- Hands-on, project-based science experiences
- An opportunity to build community and develop bonds between students, teachers, and the class as a whole through a shared experience
- An opportunity to experience field-based science in new ways

At Rogue Outdoor School, we believe the benefits of Outdoor School shouldn't be limited to a single field trip. We want students to be hands-on, asking questions, and engaging in collaborative problem solving using scientific principles as their guide in and out of the classroom. In addition to providing an overnight experience this spring, our staff will be visiting your student's classroom four different times throughout the school year. During these visits, students will practice the science skills they'll use at ODS, prepare for their trip, and at the end of the year, reflect on the learning and growing they've done.

In the weeks leading up to your student's trip to ODS, we will be hosting Family Information Night April 19th at 6pm to learn more and ask questions on Zoom, as well as a "Meet and Greet" Saturday, April 15th from 10am-1pm at Reinhart Park. More information about these events will come from your school. Rogue Outdoor School Family Prep Packet

Your student's trip to Outdoor School is right around the corner! This packet should have all the information you need to prepare yourself and your student(s) for the experience.

Before your student's trip, please complete and return the following forms to their teacher or school:

- Permission, Health, and Medical Form
- Photo Release Form
- Behavior Agreement Form

When getting ready to go to ODS, **homesickness** can be a frequent concern for both students and families. A little homesickness is a very common occurrence at ODS. For many students, this is their first extended period away from home or family. Staff and teachers work to keep students busy and engaged, and most homesickness fades away after the first night. However, there are some ways you can prepare your student(s) for the experience.

- Encourage them to have a good time: tell them you want them to make memories and return home with stories to tell you.
- Don't promise phone calls home or that you'll come get them if they call.
- Write a letter and pack in their bag for them to find.
- Focus on your excitement for the fun they're having, rather than how much you miss them!

We are hosting a **Meet and Greet** at Reinhart Park for families and students on **Saturday, April 15 from 10am-1pm** . All are welcome to come learn more about ODS. This is an opportunity for nervous students to get familiar with the program before their trip. It's also a great time for families of students with specific needs to visit with staff and ask questions they may have about accommodations for their students.

Frequently Asked Questions

When and where will my child be attending Outdoor School?

Rogue Outdoor School takes place at Camp Myrtlewood which is in Myrtle Point, OR. Students will get to the camp on buses leaving from their school. You will receive information about dates of attendance from your school.

Who do I talk to about dietary, medical, or other concerns about my student's specific needs?

Be sure to share any concerns about your student's participation at ODS with your student's teacher. If you have any questions or concerns about how we can accommodate your student's specific needs, contact the Outdoor School Coordinator at stacey@rogue-ee.com. If you have questions or concerns about medications, please contact your school. Each school will designate a health officer to manage and dispense medications while at Outdoor School.

What medicine should I send with my child?

Send any prescription medications or supplements your student takes *in the original container*. The school will designate a health officer to manage and dispense all medications, including over-the-counter medications. If you have any questions about what over-the-counter medications will be available, please contact your school. You can send additional over-the-counter medications your student might need if the school will not be supplying them (e.g. preferred painkiller in case of headaches).

All medications should be brought directly to the health officer before students board the bus and will be stored in a locked container while at ODS.

What happens if my child gets hurt or sick at Outdoor School? Are Outdoor School staff trained in first aid and CPR?

All Rogue Outdoor School staff members are certified in first aid and CPR. In the unlikely event that your child becomes ill or injured, staff will administer first aid as needed and contact you as soon as possible.

What happens if my child gets homesick?

A little homesickness is a very common occurrence at ODS. For many students, this is their first extended period away from home or family. Staff and teachers work to keep students busy and engaged and most homesickness fades away after the first night. However, there are some ways you can prepare your student(s) for the experience. Encourage them to have a good time: tell them you want them to make memories and return home with stories to tell you. Don't promise phone calls home or that you'll come get them if they call. You can write a letter and pack in their bag for them to find. Focus on your excitement for the fun they're having, rather than how much you miss them!

If staff have any significant concerns about your student's homesickness, we will reach out to you to figure out the best way to support your student.

What are the sleeping arrangements like?

Students will be assigned a cabin group that they will stay in during their time at ODS. Camp has a variety of cabin and dormitory sleeping accommodations with bunk and cot beds with mattresses. Teachers are responsible for deciding cabin groups. Cabin assignments will be separated by students' gender identity. If a student's cabin and/or bathroom assignment does not meet the student's comfort level, staff will work with the student and their family to create a solution that ensures student safety and comfort.

What are the bathrooms like?

The majority of bathrooms at Camp are separated by gender and have multiple stalls. Students use the bathrooms that best correspond to their gender identity. All-gender, single-stall bathrooms are also available to any student who desires increased privacy for any reason, including changing clothes.

Who supervises the cabins at night?

Each cabin group has an adult chaperone that stays in that cabin throughout the night. Chaperones are recruited and selected by schools and teachers.

What do chaperones do?

Chaperones are each responsible for a cabin group while at ODS. They help supervise the students in their cabin, ensure everybody is prepared and on time for activities, and role model participation, inclusion, and enthusiasm for students. Chaperones also help out with chores to keep ODS running smoothly. More information about being a chaperone can be found in the Chaperone Handbook.

How do I sign up to be a chaperone?

If you are interested in being a chaperone for your student's ODS field trip, please contact your student's teacher. Chaperones are recruited and selected by schools and teachers.

Packing List

This is a **SUGGESTED** list for students for 3 days and 2 nights. Please do not purchase new items just to satisfy this checklist. You can borrow items from other people, use old but clean clothes, buy used boots, etc. ODS has a supply of essential gear (sleeping bags, boots, rain jackets, etc.) to lend out if students are unable to bring their own or they forget something. Please mark all your student's items with their name so they are easier to return if they get lost.

Bedding

- Hiking boots or tennis shoes (waterproof if possible)
- Appropriate number of shirts, socks, and underwear for length of trip
- 2 Pairs of jeans/sturdy pants that cover the ankle

- Hat

Personal Items

- Wash cloth and/or hand towel
- Face soap
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Deodorant
- Sunscreen, lip balm

General Supplies

- Flashlight or headlamp
- Plastic bag for dirty or wet clothes
- Small bag of soil from a meaningful place
- Book to read or journal/sketchbook for quiet time

Do NOT Bring

- Expensive items like jewelry
- Clothing with inappropriate language or references to religion, sex, tobacco, drugs, or alcohol
- Food or candy
- Phones or gaming consoles
- Weapons (including pocket knives)
- Makeup, perfumes, or scented lotions

If students bring items that are not allowed at ODS, these items will be stored in a secure location that students are not allowed to access. The items will be returned to students or their teachers before they return home.

All students and adults participating in Rogue ODS programs must fill out this form completely. Return this form to your teacher/group leader as early as possible. A health officer (usually the teacher) is responsible for all medical and insurance information for each student and adult, and for collecting all medication and ensuring that each student receives medications as prescribed.

Rogue Outdoor School Behavior Agreement

At Outdoor School, we believe every student will be successful if they are able and that it is our responsibility to ensure students have what they need to be as successful as possible. We focus our behavior management on supporting students to participate constructively, rather than on punishing them for disruptive behavior. As such, families may be contacted for input and support if their student is struggling with their behavior during ODS.

Sending Students Home

Our top priority is ensuring everyone has a safe and enjoyable time at ODS. If a student's behavior is threatening the safety or well-being of themselves or others, they may be sent home. Behaviors that can result in being sent home include:

- Violent acts or threats of violence
- Possession of alcohol, narcotics, marijuana, or tobacco products
- Theft or vandalism
- Possession of a weapon
- Offensive behavior or remarks, including the use of racial, religious, or sexual slurs or intimidation, or overt sexual behavior
- Leaving supervision

All transportation, costs, and logistics for a student's removal are the responsibility of the student's family.

Searches

Rogue ODS strives to ensure a physical and learning environment which protects the health, safety, and welfare of students and staff. As part of this goal, program staff may at any time search program facilities and equipment including cabins. Neither staff nor students have a reasonable expectation of privacy regarding program facilities or equipment. Program staff may, subject to the requirements below, search a student's person and property, including property assigned by the program for the student's use. Searches may be conducted at any time.

All student searches for evidence of a violation will be conducted by the program staff subject to the following requirements:

1. Program staff members shall have individualized, "reasonable suspicion" to believe evidence of a violation of law, administrative regulation, or school or program rule, or otherwise prohibited possession is present in a particular place. Program staff may also search when they have reasonable information that emergency/dangerous circumstances exist.
2. The search shall be "reasonable in scope." That is, the measures used are reasonably related to the objectives of the search and not excessively intrusive in light of the age, gender, and maturity of the student and nature of the infraction.
3. The search will be conducted by the Site Lead in the presence of the student's teacher, with at least one additional Outdoor School staff member in attendance.

Program staff may seize and destroy any item which is evidence of a violation of law, administrative regulation, or school or program rule, or otherwise is prohibited by law, policy, regulation, or rule.

Rules at Outdoor School

Please read through the following rules with your student(s) so that everybody is familiar with the expected community behaviors.

- All school policies and rules apply while participating in Rogue ODS programs. If a rule is not stated, common sense, good judgment, courtesy, respect, and safety apply.
- All living creatures, including people, are to be treated with courtesy and respect. This means the use of obscenities, jokes or slurs relating to another's race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, or physical or mental

abilities is not allowed. It also means that plants, creatures, and all of nature deserve your respect and should not be damaged, injured, or harassed.

- Handling or harassing potentially dangerous organisms (animals, plants, insects, etc.) is not allowed.
- Stay with your group, be a good listener, and wear your nametag at all times.
- Stay out of other cabins and be respectful of others' sleeping areas and belongings.
- Use the buddy system. Wherever you go, you should always have an adult and at least one student buddy at all times. Students should never be alone with an adult one-on-one.
- Treat your ODS materials with care and use them as directed, at the appropriate time.
- Unsafe activities must be avoided at all times (e.g. no climbing trees, running, sliding or jumping on rough, slick areas). Walk wherever you go.
- Violations of these policies, particularly those relating to an individual's physical or mental health, will result in staff intervention and may result in removal from the program.

Upon arrival, students will go through an orientation, which will review these and other ODS policies including up-to-date COVID-19 safety guidelines.

Rogue Outdoor School (Escuela al Aire Libre de Rogue) Reglas y Políticas para Todos los Participantes:

Padres y maestros, por favor lean las siguientes políticas con sus estudiantes para que todos estén familiarizados con los comportamientos comunitarios esperados. Firme y devuelva este formulario al menos una semana antes de su programa.

Durante su experiencia en la Escuela al Aire Libre, participará de forma virtual, independiente y al aire libre. Es posible que esté explorando la ciencia y el aire libre de nuevas formas. Es importante que tenga una experiencia de ODS (EAL- Escuela al Aire Libre) segura y agradable. El objetivo de estas políticas es garantizar que tengan la oportunidad de desarrollar habilidades académicas y sociales en un entorno seguro.

1. Todas las reglas y políticas de la escuela se aplican al participar en los programas de Rogue ODS (EAL-Escuela al Aire Libre). Si no está establecida una regla, se aplicará el sentido común, el buen juicio, la cortesía, el respeto y la seguridad.
2. Todas las criaturas vivientes, incluyendo las personas, deben ser tratadas con cortesía y respeto. Esto excluye el uso de obscenidades, bromas o insultos relacionados con la raza, religión, género, orientación sexual o habilidades físicas o mentales de otra persona. También significa que las plantas, las criaturas y toda la naturaleza merecen su respeto y no deben ser dañados, heridos o acosados.
3. Ningún adulto puede estar nunca solo con un niño en una situación de uno en uno (incluso virtualmente).
4. Está prohibido manipular o acosar organismos (animales, plantas, insectos, etc.) potencialmente peligrosos.
5. Trata sus materiales de ODS (EAL-Escuela al Aire Libre) con cuidado y utilízalos como se indica, en el momento apropiado.
6. Las actividades inseguras deben evitarse en todo momento (por ejemplo, no trepar a los árboles, correr, resbalar o saltar en áreas ásperas y resbaladizas).
7. Las violaciones a estas políticas, particularmente aquellas relacionadas con la salud física o mental de un individuo, resultará en una acción disciplinaria y pueden resultar en la remoción del programa.
